## Golf Tips for Cooler Weather Nick Schon, Head Golf Professional

As the weather turns cooler, here are a few simple tips to help you improve your score!

### 1. STRETCH!!!

Your body reacts just like a rubber band in the golf swing. When it's hot and sunny, the band is much more flexible than when it's a little chilly out. Key areas to stretch in cooler weather including your back and leg muscles.

### 2. WEAR LAYERS

Not only is it important to stretch before golf, but to stay warm during your round. Wear loose fitting layers of clothing to keep your body flexible, and most importantly unthawed!

### 3. PLAY A SOFTER BALL

Playing a golf ball with a lower compression (50-80) will help maximize distance on each shot. Golf balls travel shorter distances when the temperatures drop, so playing a low compression ball can help to gain some of the distance back!
